Dr Graham Gudgin is an Honorary Research Associate at the Centre For Business Research in the Judge Business School at the University of Cambridge, Chief Economic Advisor at Policy Exchange in London and also co-edits 'BriefingsforBrexit', a pro-Brexit academic website.

Dr Leslie Budd, a Reader in Social Enterprise in the Department of Public Leadership and Social Enterprise at the Open University Business School and also Visiting Professor here at the Centre for Brexit Studies at Birmingham City University.
