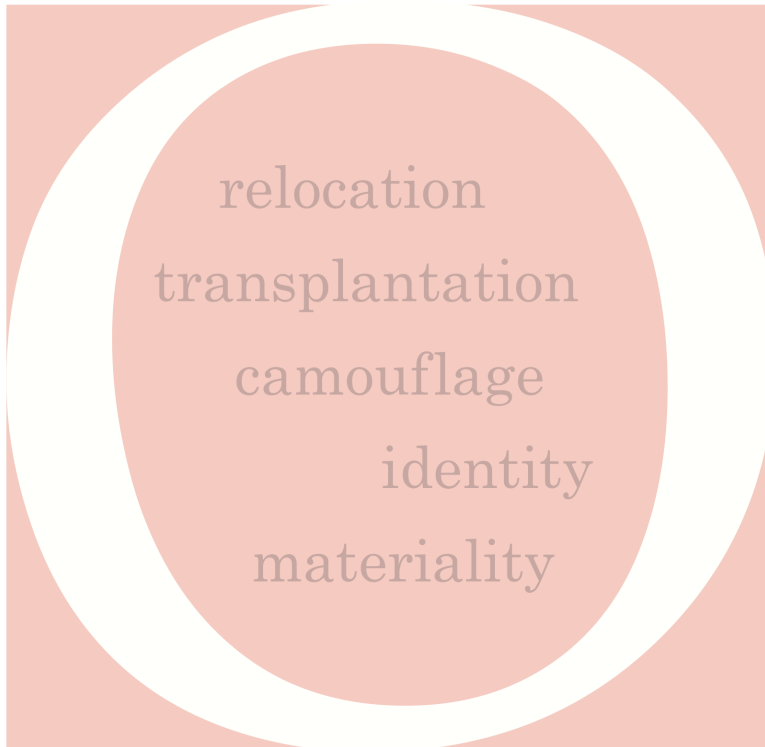

Part of the week was a field work in North Berwick, an area frequently visited by the famous Geologist James Hutton

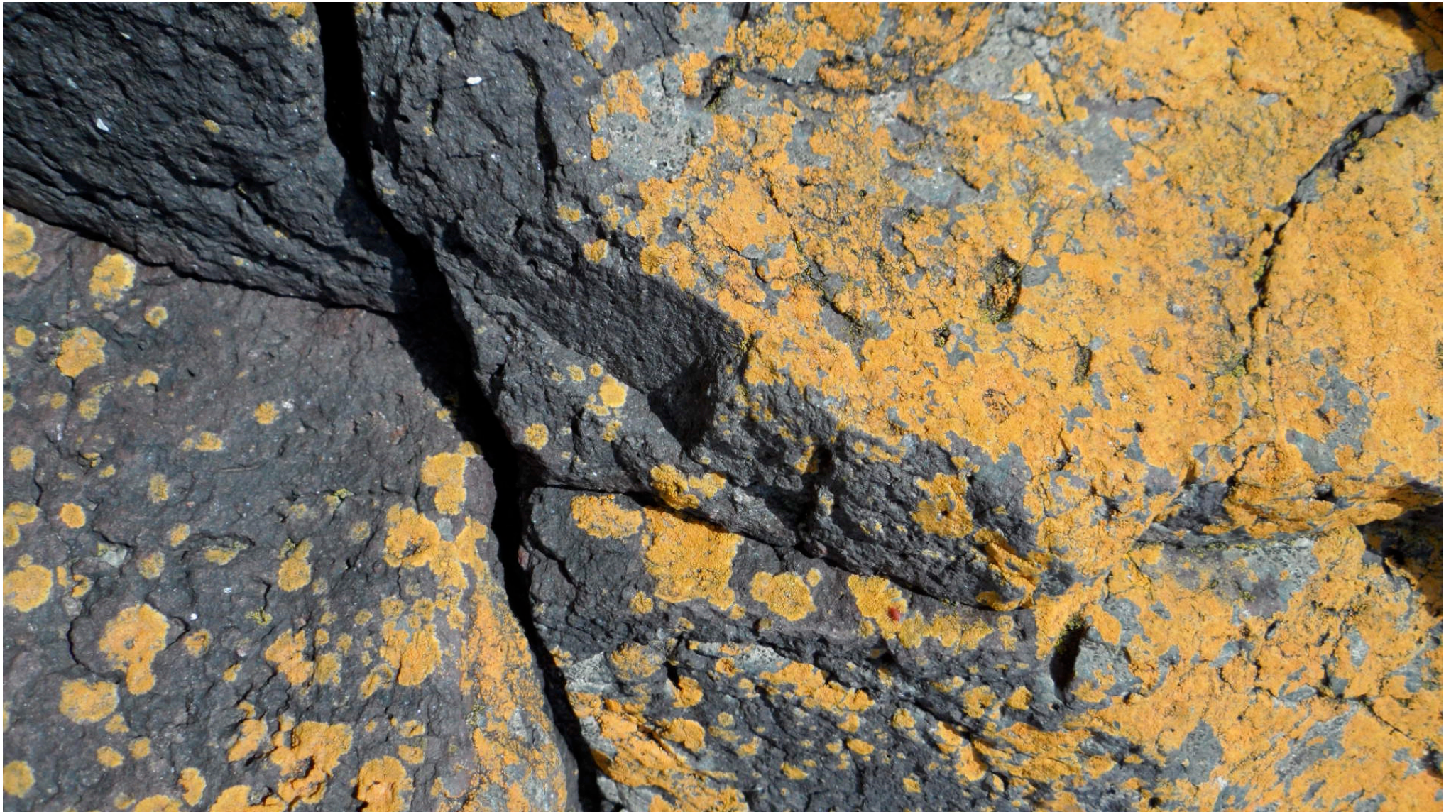




































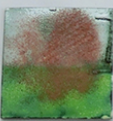

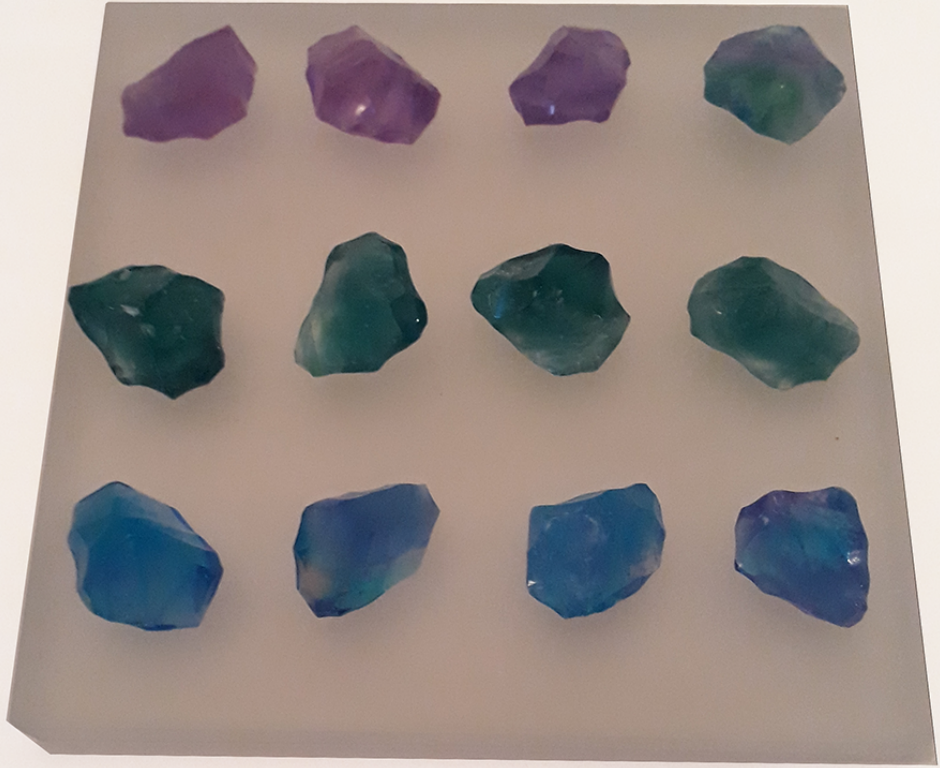
