

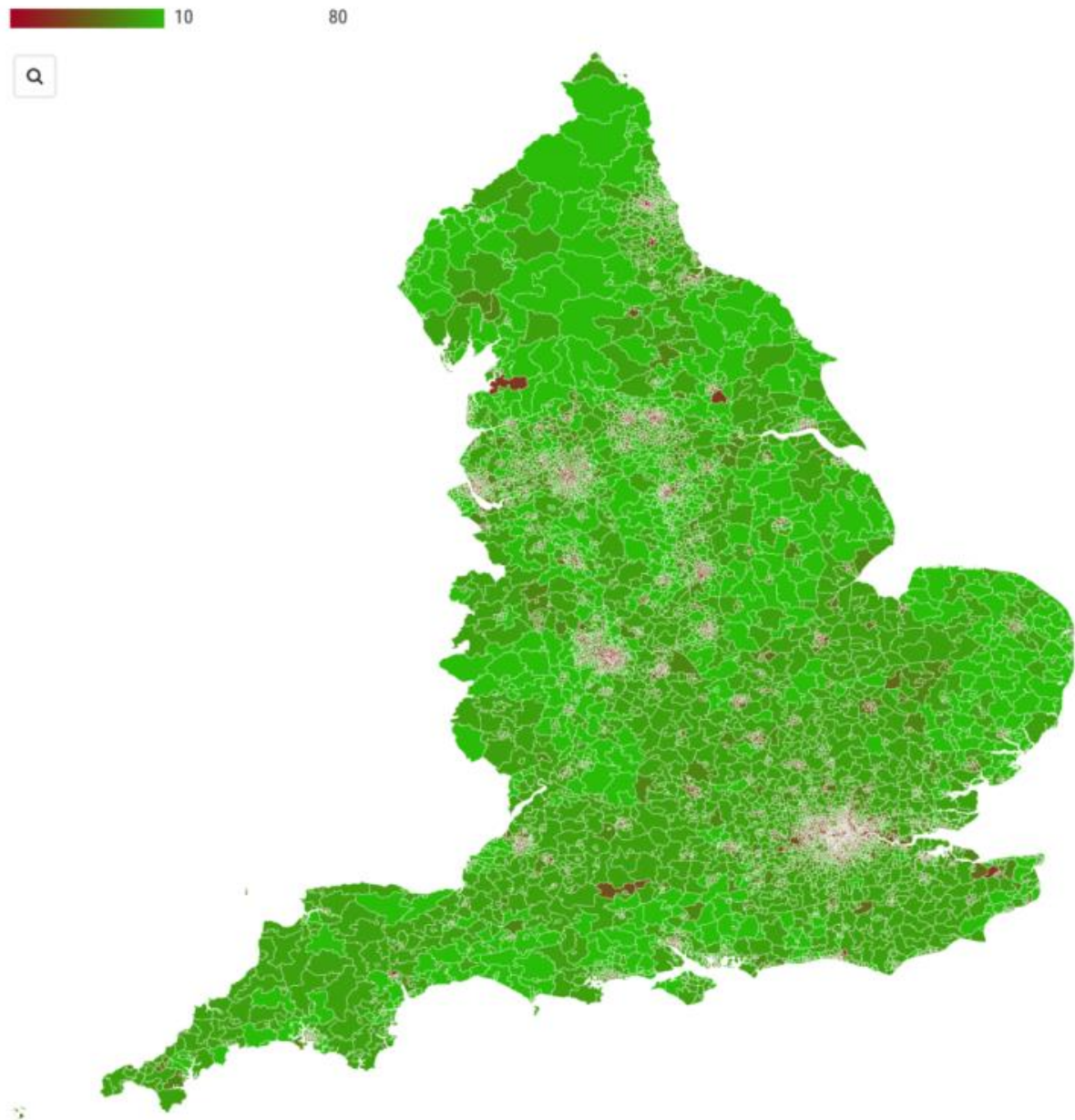
And the Covid-19 Vaccination Gold Medal goes to.....Brookside?

The Covid-19 Vaccination Olympic medals tables – and why hyperlocal data shows our big cities are trailing the field, some of their areas in danger of not finishing.

[6,791](#) very local English neighbourhoods are competing in a race to vaccinate their populations. It's a very tight race. The lead has changed hands again and again. It will probably end up in a photo finish.

The gold medal position as it stands is currently with **Brookside and Walton** in **Chesterfield**, the double jabbed-up neighbourhood with a superb 89.9% of its adult population fully vaccinated. They need a slight acceleration to be the first actually over 90%. It will come.

But will they be pipped to the post by one-time clear leaders, **East Felixstowe**, in **East Suffolk**, less than 0.2% behind them?

Bronze as it stands is currently with the delightfully named neighbourhood of **Amble, Shilbottle and Swarland**, in **Northumberland** at 88.9%

Just as the great Lauren Price, the Welsh Boxing Gold 2021 Olympian excitedly talked about the postbox outside her house turning gold, perhaps the Royal Mail should consider painting a post box gold in the middle of Brookside and Walton, East Felixstowe, and Amble, Shilbottle and Swarland? Or perhaps England's first top 20 to reach, say, 95%?

There is a huge tail of competitors at the back of the field mainly based in the middle of the big cities and often these are the student/university neighbourhoods. As I pointed out in my last blog, they have some level of excuse in that their adult student populations likely left for home before the youngsters started to be jabbed, they're online, or they've been counted elsewhere.

Nevertheless, when term starts next month tracing who's been jabbed at home and who's still not been jabbed at uni is absolutely crucial to the wider Vaccination programme.

So, to set against the leaders knocking on the door of 90% equivalently double jabbed, we can spy right at the back, the 3 places which have barely managed 19%.

More than 8 out of 10 adults in these neighbourhoods are not double-jabbed or have had its equivalent.

So whilst the All **England** statistics look very impressive indeed, with over 66% of England's total adult population fully vaccinated, and almost 80% having had 1 jab, these figures hides a very low take-up in some parts of our big cities and urban areas even outside the university neighbourhoods. The significantly higher double vaccination rates in Scotland and Wales also explain why the UK double vaccination figure at 75% is much higher than England's city-heavy totals.

If you're walking around East Felixstowe, you can be confident that 9 out of 10 people around you are double jabbed. If you're walking around, say, East Saltley in Birmingham, more than half the population have not even had one jab, and barely a third have had two. Or rather two thirds of the jostling adult population around you have not had two jabs.

There are 6,791 roughly equally-sized neighbourhoods called MSOAs (based on census areas of about 8,000). Because they are roughly the same size, they are handy in comparing things like vaccination rates.

The good news is that over half of neighbourhoods have over 70% of their adults fully vaccinated; the bad news is that those **not fully vaccinated are in the majority in 11% of neighbourhoods**. The further bad news is that these areas tend to be next to each other and are mainly in our big cities and towns. They are not usually surrounded by buffer zones of double-vaccinated neighbourhoods.

In London, only 1 neighbourhood (Upminster North & Cranham West, Havering) out of 983 has achieved over 80% double vaccinated. 4 out of 10 neighbourhoods in London have not yet met 50% double-vaccinated or equivalent, so those not fully vaccinated in those 394 neighbourhoods are in the majority.

Similarly in Birmingham, only 4 neighbourhoods get past 80%, all in the (somewhat semi-detached from Birmingham) Royal Town of Sutton Coldfield. Almost 40% of Birmingham's 132 neighbourhoods have not yet met 50% double vaccinated. In a quarter of neighbourhoods over 60% of adults have not had 2 jabs.

There seems also to come into play the significant effect that older and wealthier rural neighbourhoods in relatively less populated areas are getting their double jabs massively quicker.

More densely populated and poorer urban areas are left trailing behind. This is, of course, healthcare and demonstrates a long-standing healthcare theorem – Tudor Hart’s inverse Care law. In other words, those who most need medical care are least likely to receive it. Conversely, those with least need of health care tend to use health services more (and more effectively). Although in the context of Covid-19 it needs some modification to reflect the massively more dangerous impact on the old.

In my next blog I’ll look at the hyperlocal vaccination data in our big cities.

As I suggested in my last blog, the only Covid-19 issue that matters from a public policy point of view is the vaccination programme. It’s been a remarkable success and huge parts of even the developed world would give their eye-teeth for some of the weaker stats in the UK. But they also need to learn from us for themselves down the line, and we need in England to concentrate now on double jabbing in our big cities, where all of the evidence so far in terms of harm suggests it is, in any event, needed most.
