RapidILL Working Group Achievements

Recognizing Contributions:

- 237 trained in Analytics
- July 2025 Alma release includes reports
- 2,574 votes in CERV 2025 (11%)
- #2 idea: Patron Notes transfer
- Collaboration across continents
